70 people of capacity

This is a nursing home for persons with serious disabilities. Help is provided for every part of life. We help hobby activities and physical training. We try to correspond to the needs of each person by grouping users in a small number, 8 persons a group. Medical center is in the building. Physical therapy and linguistic therapy are provided.

◆ Short Stay at Agape Ichibankan

4 people of capacity

This is a short stay service for those who live in local community. Four private rooms are available for persons with physical disabilities.

◆ Agape Support Center

20 people of capacity

This is a day care service. We pick up persons with disabilities who live in local community to this center and offer services like meals, bathing and day time activities.

◆ Agape Medical Center

This is a medical center in Agape Center.
Health insurance is applied.

◆ Consultation Support Center

Consultation and coordination are provided to provide various welfare services to persons with disabilities and their families in order to support their daily lives.

◆Zama City Core Consultation Support Center for Children & Adults with Disabilities

Since October 2019, JCWS has been trusted by Zama City as designated manager to provide consultation to support persons with disabilities.

Japan Church World Service

History

After the Second World War, mainly North American churches sent relief supplies to Japan, Licensed Agencies for Relief in Asia, abbreviated as LARA. Church World Service was in charge of distribution of supplies. Japan Church World Service, JCWS, was established in 1952 and took over this distribution of LARA supplies. JCWS also started various social works. Since 1958, when it became a Social Welfare Organization, JCWS started to put more emphasis in welfare for people with disabilities. Agape Center in Suginami-ku, Tokyo, and welfare factory Jiritsusha in Zama, Kanagawa, were the leading work places for persons with disabilities. Since then JCWS has been highly evaluated for nursing home for persons with physical disabilities and support for persons with disabilities at the welfare factory.

1952 Japan Church World Service was established in Ginza, Chuo-ku

1957 Tape Library for persons with visual disabilities started and continued until 2003

1958.8 Social Welfare Corporation Japan Church World Service, establishment was approved

1961.4 Agape Workshop opened in Suginami-ku, Tokyo. The workshop continued in this location until 1964.

1969.4 Welfare factory Jiritsusha was established in Zama, Kanagawa and continued until 1999.

1974.4 Tokyo-to Itabashi Welfare Factory was trusted to be managed by JCWS.

1974.6. Agape Daini Sagyosho, nursing home for persons with serious physical disabilities opened in Komatsubara, Zama, Kanagawa. 50 people of capacity. This continued until 2005.

1980.6 Agape Exchange Training Program started.

1997.8 Agape Daiichi Sagyosho, workshop for commuting persons with physical disabilities opened. This continued until 1999.

1999.4 Agape Ichibankan, a nursing home for persons with physical disability opened in Komatsubara, Zama, Kanagawa. 50 people of capacity.

1999.4 Agape Support Center, a day care nursing service started in Komatsubara, Zama, Kanagawa.

2002.10 National Diet Library Copy Service Center started.

2005.4 Addition was made to Agape Ichibankan, nursing home. The new south wing added 30 people of capacity.

2006.10 Agape Daini Sagyousho added welfare service business for persons with disabilities. 40 people of capacity.

2007.4 Management of Shinjukuritsu Shinjuku Fukushi Sagyosho was trusted by Shinjuku-ku. Jobs are offered to persons with intellectual disabilities. 75 people of capacity.

2008.4 Management of Zama City Mokuseien, nursing business for persons with intellectual disabilities was trusted to JCWS. 30 people of capacity.

2009.4 Management of Zama City Sunny Kids, a day care nursing service for children were trusted to JCWS.

2009.12 Smile Market inside train station of "Takashimadaira" opened in Itabashi-ku, Tokyo.

2010.9 Group Home Smile, Cohabitation nursing home opened in Sagamigaoka, Zama-shi, Kanagawa. 6 people of capacity.

2012.4 Tokyo-to Itabashi Welfare Factory was handover to JCWS. The factory shifted to a multi-functional facility with A and B type support for continuous employment.

2012.4 Itabashi-ku Employment Support Center for Persons with Disabilities was trusted to be managed by JCWS.

2014.7 Group Home Smile II, Cohabitation nursing home opened in Sagamigaoka, Zama-shi, Kanagawa. 8 people of capacity

2015.1 Rebuilding new construction of Tokyo-to Itabashi Welfare Factory was completed.

2015.5 Transition support for employment of Tokyo-to Itabashi Welfare Factory started

2019.4 Shinjyuku-ku Shinjyukuritsu Shinjyuku Fukushi Sagyosho was shifted to a multi-functional facility with B type support which has 50 people of capacity, and nursing service which has 25 people of capacity.

2019.4 Agape Sagyosyo was renamed by combining Agape Daiichi Sagyosyo and Agape Daini Sagyosyo.

2019.10 Zama City Core Consultation Support Center for Children & Adults with Disabilities was trusted to be managed by Agape Center of JCWS.
